MERLOT

Soft and supple are the key words for describing this grape. Depending on the winemaker's style, Merlot can be medium bodied with soft, plummy fruit to fuller bodied with richer flavours.

SYRAH / SHIRAZ

Same grape, very different styles. It produces full, rich wines of intense colour and flavour. In cooler climates, like the Pacific Northwest, it has more pepper & spice aromas and flavours. In warmer climates, like Australia, it is often jammy and riper tasting.

CABERNET SAUVIGNON

A well structured varietal with firm, thick skins and juicy black fruit. In the most classic style, you will find firm tannins, cassis, Bing cherry, plenty of oak and spicy cedar scents with hints of mint.

OTHER WORLDLY REDS SINGLE VARIETAL

A selection of wines for those with bored palates or on the quest for something a little extra special. Either a single grape that isn't among the most recognizable or a winemaker's obscure, artistic creation, you will discover some thing very special here.

BLENDS

WINE DIRECTOR'S PICK

Syrah, Laughing Stock Vineyards, Hedge Vineyard, VQA, Okanagan Valley, BC, Canada The wine opens with a nose of dark chocolate cherry ganache, peppered bacon and black currents. On the palate, the wine has notes of ripe black cherries, bramble, charcuterie and a touch of sage.



CHAMPAGNE & SPARKLING WINE

Bubbles are great in celebration or when enjoying a wide variety of foods. Try the charming bubbles from various regions of the world or go with the original that can only truly be called Champagne.

ROSÉ

With one foot in the red world and one foot in the white, these dry style wines offer complexity, ripe fruit flavours, and are perfect for food pairing.

RIESLING

A favourite among wine geeks. This wine can be dry, off-dry and all the way to sweet. Either way, the Rieslings of Germany, Australia and the Pacific Northwest are sublime in their lemony, peachy, mineral dance on the palate.

PINOT GRIS / GRIGIO

Same grape, but very different styles. Light and friendly from Italy or fruity, slightly sweet & complex from the Pacific Northwest.

GEWÜRZTRAMINER

Dry or off-dry, this aromatic white can be light to full bodied and still exhibit the floral juiciness of this varietal.

SAUVIGNON BLANC

Originating in Bordeaux, this "wild white" grape is now planted in many of the world's wine regions, including the Okanagan Valley. These crisp, dry and refreshing wines can be very elegant and herbaceous or exhibit full, ripe, tropical fruit flavours.

CHARDONNAY

This wine comes in a variety of styles from all over the world and can exhibit flavours ranging from crisp, fresh apple, citrus and melon when un-oaked all the way to rich, complex buttery flavours when fully oaked.
